- 1957: Dello Joio proposes the Young Composers Project (YCP)
- 1959 1961: Two year pilot program (12 composers, 12 sites)
- CMP: 1961-1973: 77 composers in 73 school systems
 - 1961 1966: Composers in the Public Schools (CPS)
 - 1966 1973: Professionals in Residence & Teacher education program (Comprehensive Musicianship Program)




